




As more than a year has passed since the coronavirus pandemic was declared, leading evangelical aid organization World Vision partnered with tens of thousands of faith leaders and communities worldwide to reach 59 million people through relief and virus prevention efforts. Not long after the World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a pandemic on March 11, 2020, World Vision, an interdenominational aid organization that operates in nearly 100 countries, launched the largest global response in its 70-year history.

Erica Van Deren, a senior program manager on World Vision's emergency response team, told The Christian Post that as the world was shutting down, World Vision kept working since that is the purpose God has bestowed on the organization and its staff. "COVID-19 has been our

The Profile of an Encourager!

Barnabas' real name was Joses, or Joseph, but he was given by the apostles the name Barnabas, which means "Son of Encouragement" or "Son of Exhortation" (Acts 4:36). Being "full of the Holy Spirit" (Acts 11:24), Barnabas outrivaledin encouragement and exhortation. The Bible says that, "He was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and faith, and a great number of people were brought to the Lord" (Acts 11: 24).

About his background, we have scant information! We are told that he was a Levite from the island of Cyprus (Acts 4: 37). We are not told, nevertheless, whether the land he sold was in Judea or in Cyprus. He was either a cousin or an uncle to Mark the evangelist and Gospel writer (Colossians 4:10) and was seen as a great mentor to him. We see Barnabas' first activity in relation to the church in Acts 4: 36-37 and there we read him selling a land he owned to help provide for the poor fellow brethren in the church at Jerusalem. In fact, in those days in 31 AD, the church was in severe economic need as it had to look after the natives who had sold all they had and the nonnatives who remained post the inception of the church at Pentecost.

He was a true encourager! Firstly, we see a clear account of this in Acts 9 in relation to the conversion of Paul and the aftermath. When Paul wanted to maintain a relationship with the Jerusalem church after his conversion, the church was suspicious and it was Barnabas who stood by Paul and testified of him that he was accepted. Many in Jerusalem church must have

been concerned to see Paul again, especially remembering his brutal deeds in their lives. It was Barnabas who verified the conversion of Paul. In another instance, we see him being sent to Antioch to support the new believers there (Acts 11: 22-24). The new believers at Antioch needed encouragement and direction and there was no other fitting person other than Barnabas. He understood what God's plan of bringing gentiles (non-Israelites) into the Church and undoubtedly spent the rest of his life serving God with this in mind.

Barnabas was a good trainer too! As mentioned already, Paul was mentored by him in the former's initial days as a Christian and as a teacher at Antioch. Afterward, Barnabas took Paul and a young disciple, John Mark, author of the Gospel bearing his name, on a trip (which is also known as Paul's first missionary journey) through Asia Minor. In the accounts in relation to this in Acts, we see both Paul and Barnabas mentioned as "apostles" (14:14) as, I suppose, they both had possessed the qualities and qualifications fitting to an apostle. But in the second missionary journey when they decided to revisit and encourage the churches they had established in the first, Paul and Barnabas had serious disagreements because of John Mark who had returned home in the middle of the first journey due to some sickness. Barnabas insisted that they should take Mark. With this being a bone of contention, they went separate ways (Acts 15:36-41). Barnabas took Mark to Cyprus and continued the ministry while training him

thereafter finally to become a disciple of Peter, under whose influence he wrote his gospel. John Mark, later, became so strong and mature in ministry and in time he proved himself even to the Apostle Paul. When Paul wrote the Colossians, he instructed them that if John Mark came, they were to welcome him (Col. 4:10). Paul even listed Mark as a fellow worker (Philem. 24). Later, Paul told Timothy to "Get Mark and bring him with you, for he is useful to me for ministry" (2 Tim. 4:11). This was all possible, indubitably, by the ministry of Barnabas who was not willing to desert a young minister who was hurt and rejected.

About his martyrdom, like his background, we have insufficient information. As per the known records, he was martyred in Cyprus while speaking with the Jews in a Synagogue, as he always did. They dragged him out having bound a rope to his neck, tortured him in the most possible inhumane ways and finally burned him. It is also said that it was John Mark who kept the remains of Barnabas in a cave in Cyprus.

He was a man who lived his name, the encourager. He encouraged and trained everyone as per the gift he was given by the Lord and that should be a great lesson to us. Be an Encouraging Christian! May God Bless You!



Same-sex marriage can't be considered lawful in the Church because there are grounds to consider it "even remotely analogous and non-Catholics say, 'Well, where is the Church on this issue? It seems to be bending toward their way.' And now, I think this will put an end to it. And if people who are Catholic don't like it, well, they are going to have to change their status then."

The Vatican released a statement Monday announcing that churches have no power to bless same-sex marriage since God "cannot bless sin," which clarifies Pope Francis' stance on same-sex unions.

The Vatican's statement comes after Pope Francis said during a documentary interview last October that he believes civil union laws should be created to legally cover same-sex couples in the civil sphere. "Homosexual people have a right to be in a family. They are children of God and have a right to a family. Nobody should be thrown out or be

to God's plan for marriage and family," the

Donohue said this was an awkwardlyphrased statement by the pope. But while some Catholics have urged Pope Francis to bless gay marriage in the past, the statement released today settles his position on samesex unions. Donohue said the statement came from the top doctrinal office of the Catholic Church and would not be released without receiving the Pope's blessing.

"I was actually struck by the fact that it was so definitive," Donohue said. "They really slammed the door shut on this issue. And I think it's welcome because some Catholics In its statement, the Vatican said that the unlawful blessing of same-sex unions is not "a form of unjust discrimination, but rather a reminder of the truth of the liturgical rite and of the very nature of the sacramentals, as the Church understands them."

The Vatican's response said the Christian community and pastors should "welcome with respect and sensitivity persons with homosexual inclination" and find appropriate ways to "proclaim to them the Gospel in its fullness." "But [God] does not and cannot bless sin: he blesses sinful man, so that he may recognize that he is part of his plan of love and allow himself to be changed by him. He in fact 'takes us as we are, but never leaves us as we are," the statement added.

The Catholic Church's stance goes beyond gay marriage since it will not bless any union against God's design of marriage, Donohue concluded. "We can take it a step further," he shared. "The Church will never bless cohabitation. This is not just with homosexuals. There are guys and gals who live together outside of marriage, and the Church does not recognize that. This is not strictly about homosexuals, although they are the ones who are pushing for it, obviously. But it would apply to any union that is outside of [licit marriage]."

The Vatican's Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith issued a formal response to a question about whether Catholic churches have the power to bless same-sex unions. The question comes when "plans and proposals for blessings of unions of persons of the same sex are being advanced" in some "ecclesial contexts."

"... It is not licit to impart a blessing on relationships, or partnerships, even stable, that involve sexual activity outside of marriage ...," the Vatican statement reads. "As is the case of the unions between persons of the same sex. The presence in such relationships of positive elements, which are in themselves to be valued and appreciated, cannot justify these relationships and render them legitimate objects of an ecclesial blessing, since the positive elements exist within the context of a union not ordered to the Creator's plan."

In a Monday interview with The Christian Post, Bill Donohue, president of the Catholic League, which claims to be the nation's largest Catholic civil rights organization, said the statement was "very much" welcomed because it removed doubt about the Vatican's position on this topic. "This [decision] finishes it," Donohue said. "There's nothing left to discuss. It's non-negotiable. The Vatican left nothing on the table with these people pushing this agenda. It made it very clear that the Church can bless homosexuals as individuals, but it will never ever bless

CHRISTIAN GROUPS LAMENT PASSAGE OF BILL REQUIRING LESSONS ON ATHEISM, HUMANISM IN ALL WELSH SCHOOLS



Christian law firms have expressed concerns over the passing of a bill that would make it mandatory for all schools, including faith schools, in Wales to teach humanism on an equal footing with religions as well as broaden sex education themes and content. The provisions of the Curriculum and Assessment (Wales) Bill, which is set to become law after passing all debate stages,

amount to "transferring the right of parents to decide their child's best interests about sex and religious education to the State," writes Elizabeth Francis, a legal officer for human rights group Alliance Defending Freedom, U.K., in an op-ed for The Conservative Woman.The Bill would change the term

"religious education" to "religion, values, and ethics" so that non-religious worldviews can be taught alongside Christianity and other religious beliefs. It would also allow humanists to be part of the bodies that oversee and develop the syllabus, according to The Christian Institute. An proposal included giving atheists a veto over any religious teaching in schools, but the clause was later dropped. However, it still "allows for disproportionate time to be spent studying Humanism or atheism. It also repealed key safeguards on the teaching of sex education," the Institute says. Welsh Government ignored two public consultations which clearly opposed these changes," the Institute's Wales Officer, Gareth Edwards, said. "In the last census only 815 people said they were humanists in the whole of Wales. Why have they been handed such influence over the content of religious teaching in schools?" he asked. Kathy Riddick of Wales Humanists, a group that lobbied for the law's passage, celebrated the lawmakers' decision. "We are absolutely delighted that the Senedd has passed this bill and that, after many years of campaigning

Edwards added, "While this is a setback, Christians will still be able to have a positive influence in schools by responding to the public consultation on the RSE code in due course, and parents should also expect to be consulted by their schools before changes are brought in."

Francis warned, however, that it's likely "the Welsh law will act as the final pretext the Scottish parliament needs to move forward with plans to remove the current discretion given to faith schools when teaching sex education."

"Particularly when it comes to sensitive topics, the primary role of parents has always been respected as they are best placed to determine what is age-appropriate for the background, culture, and developmental maturity of their children," she added.

Francis said the governments in England and Wales appear to be "legislating deliberately to neglect parental rights — principles long upheld both domestic and internationally."

"The reforms also show the speed at which education policy is shifting," she warned.

monastic life in the region as far back as the fifth century A.D.

French-Norwegian archeologists made the discovery at the Tal Ganoub Qasr al-Agouz site in the Western Desert's Bahariya Oasis, according to

a statement from the Egyptian Ministry of Tourism and Antiquities. "During its third season, the Norwegian-French archaeological mission working in Qasr Al-Agouz in Bahariya Oasis revealed a number of buildings made of basalt stone, carved into rocks and buildings constructed of mud bricks," the statement explains.

The complex comprises six sectors containing the ruins of three churches and monks' cells. The "walls bear graffiti and symbols with Coptic connotations," said Osama Talaat, head of Islamic, Coptic and Jewish Antiquities at the ministry.

Mission head Victor Ghica said that archaeologists made similar excavations of 19 structures embedded in the bedrock last year. The church walls "bear writings in yellow ink that include religious writings from the Bible in Greek," revealing "the nature of monastic life in the region," Ghica explained, adding that monks were clearly present there since the fifth century A.D.

The Egyptian Ministry said that the recently-discovered site is very "important" since it reveals previously unknown information about the planning of early monastic buildings and the formation of the first monastic congregations in Egypt.

The Guardian quotes the French Institute of Oriental Archaeology as stating that the site located in the desert southwest of Cairo was occupied from the fourth to eighth centuries, with a likely peak of activity around the fifth and sixth centuries.

The institute — the organization in charge of the mission — added that previous excavations in 2009 and 2013 shed light on other subjects, including "the production and preservation of wine as well as the husbandry of animals" in a monastic context.

In recent months, Egypt has presented several archaeological finds hoping to "revive tourism," which has suffered in recent years. The Copts, who make up about 10% of Egypt's population, are the descendants of a long line of ancient Egyptians who later converted to Christianity in the early first century, according to Encyclopedia Britannica.

Christian monasticism first emerged in Egypt at the beginning of the fourth century, originating with St. Anthony, considered the founder and father of the practice.

Anthony began to practice an ascetic life at the age of 20. After 15 years, he withdrew for absolute solitude to a mountain by the Nile River, where he lived from about 286 to 305, notes Encyclopedia Britannica.

The early monks who followed Anthony into the desert "considered themselves the vanguard of God's army, and, by fasting and performing other ascetic practices, they attempted to attain the same state of spiritual purity and freedom from temptation that they saw realized in Anthony."

When St. Anthony died (circa 356 or 357 A.D.), two types of monasticism flourished in Egypt — villages or colonies of hermits and monasteries that fostered community life.

OVERSEAS INDIANS NEED PERMISSION FOR MISSIONARY, TABLIGH ACTIVITIES

Overseas Citizenship of India (OCI) cardholders will need special permission if they want to take up any missionary, Tabligh or journalistic activities, the Home Ministry has said in rules for overseas Indians seeking visas.

Those with OCI cards who want to take up these activities will need special permission

from the Foreign Regional Registration Office (FRRO).

Overseas Indians will also need permission to take up any research work, an internship with foreign missions or if they need to visit areas designated as restricted or protected. The OCI cardholders have to

inform the FRRO if there is a change in address.

According to sources in the Home Ministry, all the rules were part of the 'brochure' published by it on November 15, 2019, and have now been consolidated and notified. What has raised questions in the new rules

are that activities like Tabligh – a religious sect – and journalism have been mentioned in the same breath.

The Tablighi Jamaat was in sharp scrutiny after multiple coronavirus cases across the country were traced to their religious gathering in Delhi in March last year when the pandemic was spreading across the world.

In December, a Delhi court acquitted 36 foreigners charge-sheeted over the Tablighi Jamaat congregation. The passports of these visitors had been seized.

Amid a huge controversy as allegations of the gathering becoming a Covid superspreader took on religious tones, petitions asked the Supreme Court to act against the media for "spreading hatred" over the Tablighi meet at Markaz Nizamuddin.

While the Bible was burning, a fire broke out and burned down the houses



Texas officers arrested a woman after she allegedly set fire to a Bible in her backyard, which caused flames to spread to her house as well as her neighbor's home.

San Antonio firefighters raced to Midcrown Drive at around 7:30 a.m. on Sunday, after being called out to reports of a duplex being on fire. When they arrived, firefighters found two homes were on fire.

Witnesses told it was caused by a woman who had set fire to a Bible in her backyard before the blaze spread to her home and a neighbor's house.

Resident John Bailey, who said he lives next door to the woman, told the network: "I ran out, tried to use my water hose to kind of spread it off and make sure it didn't get to my sister's house."

He added that he and other neighbors had been woken up by the sound of a woman banging on their front doors shouting that a duplex was on fire. He said: "The lady came and knocked on the door, banged on the door and says: 'Oh fire, it's on fire.'"

Bailey also continued to tell the

network that he and his sister lost all their medication in the fire and that their five dogs had been taken to an animal shelter until they could find a new place for them to stay. "Hopefully we can go and stay with relatives," Bailey told the network.

Photos taken in the aftermath of the fire showed the roofs of two homes had been severely damaged and collapsed. Others appeared to show both ends of the street being blocked off by police cars and fire trucks.

Another image showed a woman in handcuffs being led away from the homes by a police officer. Her identity has not been disclosed by police.

Captain John Flores of the San Antonio Fire Department said: "We had heavy fire showing for basically two residential structures. We started applying water as much as we could."

The woman, who allegedly started the fire by burning a Bible, was later arrested by police.

There were no reports of any injuries, although the estimated damage caused by the fire is understood to be around \$150,000.

YOU CAN TAKE MY LIFE IF YOU WANT, LEAVE THEM ALONE 'NUN KNEELS BEFORE MYANMAR ARMY



A nun went down on her knees in front of policemen in a northern Myanmar town and pleaded them to stop shooting protesters agitating against last month's coup.

Video showed Sister Ann Rose Nu Tawng in a white robe and black habit kneeling on a street in the town of Myitkyina on Monday, speaking to two policemen who were also kneeling.

"I said, I don't want to see any trouble here and can't leave if police don't leave," she said. "I begged them not to shoot the children."

Tawng and one of the policemen then touched their foreheads to the ground.

At least two protesters were killed by gunshots at the head and three others were injured in the town on Monday, witnesses said.

Tawng had also come between protesters and police lines late last month, pleading for peace, local media reported.

Over 60 people have been killed and more than 1,800 detained in the crackdown on protests against the Feb. 1 coup, an advocacy group has said.

ISRAELI ARCHAEOLOGISTS DISCOVER BIBLICAL SCROLL FRAGMENTS FOR THE FIRST TIME IN 60 YEARS

Dozens of 2,000-year-old fragments from scrolls containing portions of the books of Nahum and Zechariah have been unearthed in Israel, an extremely rare discovery in the Judean Desert. The Israel Antiquities Authority announced the discovery of the uncovered fragments on Tuesday. They are the first of such discoveries in approximately 60 years. The Dead Sea Scrolls are fragments of religious manuscripts that were originally found in the Judaean Desert decades ago.

The newly discovered fragments are Greek translations of the two minor prophets. Despite most of the fragments being in Greek, the name of God is written in Hebrew. The fragments come from a larger scroll found in the same place in the 1950s in Nahal Hever in the "Cave of Horror" that is approximately 80 meters below a cliff top and can only be reached by rappelling down the cliff. In addition to the biblical fragments, a 10,500-year-old woven basket from the Pre-Pottery Neolithic period was excavated, and a 6,000-year-old mummified skeleton of a child was also found.


Also known as Cave 8 in the Judean Desert, Israeli archaeologist Yo%anan Aharonin gave it the nickname "Cave of Horror" because the skeletons of 40 men, women and children were discovered there during the Judean Desert Expeditions in the 1960s, according to the Encyclopedia of the Dead Sea Scrolls.

The Israel Antiquities Authority has been more active in rescuing ancient artifacts in the region since 2017.

Significant looting has plagued the area ever since Bedouin shepherds first discovered the Dead Sea Scrolls, also known as the Qumran Caves Scrolls, in 1946. "The desert team showed exceptional courage, dedication and devotion to purpose, rappelling down to caves located between heaven and earth, digging and sifting through them, enduring thick and suffocating dust, and returning with gifts of immeasurable worth for mankind," IAA Director Israel Hasson, who led the rescue operation, said in a statement.

"The newly discovered scroll fragments are a wake-up call to the state. Resources must be allocated for the completion of this historically important operation. We must ensure that we recover all the data that has not yet been discovered in the caves before the robbers do. Some things are beyond value."






The entire passage from Zechariah reads: "These are the things you are to do: Speak the truth to one another, render true and perfect justice in your gates. And do not contrive evil against one another, and do not love perjury, because all those are things that I hate—declares the Lord." The Nahum passage reads: "The mountains quake because of Him, And the hills melt. The earth heaves before Him, The world and all that dwell therein. Who can stand before His wrath? Who can resist His fury? His anger pours out like fire, and rocks are shattered because of Him."


The fragments were written in a "new" Greek translation that differs from the traditional Masoretic texts.

According to the IAA, the translation's differences reveal "quite a bit regarding the transmission of the biblical text" until the time of the Bar Kochba Revolt.

The Bar Kochba revolt was a rebellion of the Jews led by Simon bar Kochba against the Romans around 132-136 A.D., the last of the three major Jewish-Roman wars. The revolt is also called the Third Jewish-Roman War or Third Jewish Revolt.

"These finds are not just important to our own cultural heritage but to that of the entire world," Avi Cohen, CEO of the Ministry of Jerusalem and Heritage, said in a statement. "Without the consistent and coordinated action of the various government offices, the Israel Antiquities Authority and the Civil Administration, these special assets would not be made accessible to the public, rather would remain in the possession of antiquities looters."





Prevention Unit, said the agency finally decided to pre-empt the thieves before the treasures were looted. The scraps containing lines from Nahum and Zechariah were discovered in clumps and rolled up in the Cave of Horror.

He estimates that approximately 25% of the Judean Desert has not been surveyed, according to The Times of Israel. By using drone technology and rappelling gear, those rescuing the ancient artifacts can explore caves that have been considered "unreachable," some of which human beings have not entered for nearly 2,000 years.

CHRISTIAN CHARITY HELPS BUILD 60 HOMES FOR IMPOVERISHED WIDOWS IN GUATEMALA



When missionaries working with the international ministry World Challenge offered to build a home for 90-year-old Simona, a widow living in rural Guatemala, she balked at the idea. "She had lost children due to illness and starvation, and she was struggling with her own health. She said, 'I'm not worth it. Don't build me a home. What's the point?'" Mark Buzzetta, World Challenge's global director of mercy ministries, said in a recent interview.

"But after we came alongside her and built her a home, her joy was infectious. It was like we'd taken her out of a horrific condition and given her a palace to live in," he told The Christian Post. "Someone who had struggled for so long received a miracle. We were able to share with her that Christ loved her, that God had pointed her out to us, lifted her out of anonymity, and we had the privilege of giving her a new home."

Simona's home is just one of 60 built for widows in rural Guatemala by partners of World Challenge, a Colorado-based nondenominational Christian organization active in over 40 countries that seeks to bring biblical solutions to poverty within reach of every poor community around the world. The charity also aims to evangelize to the lost and empower, equip and encourage Christians in their daily faith.

According to Buzzetta, World Challenge's home-building project in Guatemala began in 2018 after coming into contact with a ministry that sought to build homes for local widows but had few funds or resources to make an impact.

"Our mission is to help the poorest of the poor, so we came alongside this local mission and have since accelerated their program by 100%," he said. "I've visited all of the homes that we've supported and provided for and met the people and heard their stories. And it's just unbelievable. So many of these women were just scraping by for a living. The transformation they were able to experience was truly incredible."

Buzzetta shared that many widows living in rural areas of Guatemala are marginalized, seen as little more than economic burdens and social liabilities. Part of the ministry's mission, he said, is to give them "value and dignity of life."

"We let them know that everything we do is coming from Jesus," Buzzetta said. "God has identified them. He loves them. All we are is a conduit to help them experience His love in a tangible, practical way."

Besides providing housing, food, and clean water for widows, World Challenge offers access to doctors, dentists and other healthcare professionals. Many of the women the ministry works with, he revealed, have never seen a doctor.

"Because of the region these women live in, many have sustained physical injuries or are suffering from cataracts and are unable to venture out safely," he said. "Many of them have treatable ailments that get extremely serious because they lack access to medical care."

The global director recounted the story of Louisa, a woman helped by the ministry who

had acquired a severe staph infection after gashing her leg on the mountainside.

"We immediately took her to the doctor, and it was the first time she'd ever ridden in a car," he recalled. "She was in the front seat, looking out the window, and she kept saying, 'It's so beautiful. It's so beautiful.' For her, the simplicity of riding in a car was lifechanging, and then receiving medical care and eventually a new home — the gratitude she had was just amazing."

Christians living in affluent countries can learn a great deal from those living in extreme poverty, Buzzetta said. He revealed that when he asks the widows what else the ministry can do to help them, their response is always the same: "What do you mean, 'What more?' This is everything, compared to what we had."

"We have been so conditioned with the ways of the world, namely materialism, fame, position authority, wealth," he said. "We are taught to chase after this never-ending gold ring. It's all about us. If there could ever be a message that would be contrary to the Bible, it's the message of our world. It's about Satan convincing us that our worth is based on what we have, our possessions, our position at work, our beauty."

"I think just if there was any way that we could step out of this 'me mindset' and take our eyes off of ourselves, our world would change," Buzzetta continued. "All of the things that we strive for, we stress out over, we destroy relationships over — let's refocus our eyes on Christ."

World Challenge encourages Christians worldwide to pray for those living in poverty and difficult conditions and ask the Lord to utilize their lives for His glory.

"We would love for people to help us in our widows' program both in Guatemala and around the world, but first and foremost, we just don't want money. We want people to have their hearts changed to really reach out to the Lord and truly have their hearts transformed for others," he explained.

"Let the Lord impress upon their hearts what they should do for Him," Buzzetta added. "And then if that happens to lead to us, that's great. But first and foremost, seek the Lord, seek His righteousness, and let everything else flow out of that."

largest both domestic response and international response that we've ever organized as an organization," Van Deren said in an interview. "It's been a remarkable amount of work and really just a wonderful opportunity to be the hands and feet of Jesus in this really, really challenging time."

World Vision U.S. President and CEO Edgar Sandoval said the response would not have been possible without partnerships of churches and pastors. World Vision partnered with over 124,000 faith leaders through networks already formed from responding to Ebola, HIV/AIDS and Zika virus in the past.

"This incredible work could not have been done without our valuable church partners," Sandoval said in a statement. "The Church has been a force for good — living outside its four walls and working hand-in-hand with their neighbors to distribute life-saving food, PPE, and other essentials that saved lives." In the United States alone, World Vision worked with 1,300 churches and donated 3 million boxes of fresh food to the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Farmers to Families program. The organization also provided 2.5 million units of personal protective equipment and impacted nearly 500,000 families by providing emergency essentials.

every country it operates worldwide.

Around the world, countries have faced increasing hunger. And the United Nations reported last year that virus-linked hunger led to the deaths of 10,000 more children a month over the first year of the pandemic. The World Food Program has warned that as many as 270 million people could be pushed to the brink of starvation. "We sense that we are rounding the curve here in the U.S., but I think around the world, it will be months or years until many people

are going to have the hope of a vaccine," Van

Deren said. "So, it's World Vision's job to do

all that we can right now to bring hope to



this generation of children in this second year. ..."

Van Deren said World Vision often serves as the "bridge" between the World Health Organization or the U.N. to actually get the resources to individuals in need.

World Bank predicted the pandemic could add up to 150 million people to the extreme poverty category in 2021. Unemployment has increased, and extreme poverty is on the rise for the first time in 22 years. World Vision statistics also show that child marriage and violence against females are climbing due to the pandemic.

"The secondary impacts of the virus on the world's poorest people — especially children — are deadly and long-lasting," Sandoval shared.

World Vision's efforts reached over 26 million children in the last year. "As we fight to protect people from the virus, we must also protect them from the deadly aftershocks of the pandemic," Sandoval said. "That is where World Vision will be focused. We are fully committed to empowering people living on the margins to fulfill their God-given potential."

A year later, World Vision has transitioned its pandemic response focus to encourage vaccine acceptance around the globe and address the secondary effects of the pandemic. Plans include increasing assistance to families facing huger, helping to restore families' livelihoods and informing

communities about vaccines. Van Deren said a large part of World Vision's efforts in the next year will be assisting families to "build back" their lives.

World Vision will continue to utilize partnerships with faith leaders to reach communities and promote vaccinations. "Pastors and faith leaders will continue to play a critical role as the most trusted leaders in their communities," Sandoval said. "They are essential to vaccine acceptance and reaching the most vulnerable still suffering the impacts of this deadly pandemic."

Despite the toll the pandemic had, Sandoval said World Vision has hope for the future and the lives that will be saved in the next year. "Today, we remember the millions of precious lives lost to COVID-19 — and countless more families suffering the impacts of the pandemic," Sandoval added.

"Yet, even as we mourn, we look ahead with hope to the many lives that will be saved with the rollout of the vaccine. Now as we focus on getting the vaccine to as many people as possible here in the United States, we also must not forget people living in some of the poorest countries in the world, each precious in God's sight. Unless we consider their well-being as important as our own, COVID-19 will remain a threat, here and everywhere."
